Entry Requirements:

- Applicants must be in a secondary or post-secondary Okanagan school. Home-schooled and on-line students are welcome.
- Submit a letter of reference from a teacher or community leader and a short bio highlighting any past pro-life involvement.
- Submit an original essay of at least 1000 words.
- Complete and submit the application form found at prolifekelowna.ca.
- All documents must be submitted before August 31st, 2026 by email.
- A \$1,200 award for a post-secondary student and a \$1,200 award for a secondary student will be awarded.

Choose one topic to write about:

- *What can we do to make Canada more pro-life?*
- *Why should abortion be illegal in Canada?*
- *Why is assisted suicide (MAiD) wrong?*

Grading (each worth 25%):

- Is the thesis stated clearly and is well-supported throughout?
- Is the information well-organized and flow from one idea to the next?
- Is the grammar, spelling, sentence structure, and punctuation of high standard?
- Are the ideas presented clearly and backed with logic and facts, and is the essay impactful and persuasive?

Throughout her 101 years of life, Julie had a heart for the weakest and most defenseless among us. She gave her time, energy, and resources to numerous causes in Kelowna.

Julie managed the Pro-Life Thrift Shop on Sutherland Avenue for an amazing 36 years without ever taking a dime in compensation, all for a whole class of human beings whose very personhood today's culture refuses to acknowledge: pre-born babies.

Julie's dedication to the pro-life cause was profound, deep, and unwavering. It was a big part of who she was and she inspired many people to stand up and speak out for the voiceless, defenseless child in the womb.

Pro-Life and More:

Julie supported Inn From the Cold, Freedom's Door Recovery, Society of Vincent de Paul, The Salvation Army, Share, and many others who serve the less fortunate.

She established the French Cultural Centre in 1960, co-founded Kelowna Right to Life and the Seaton Centre for Seniors, and served on the Catholic Women's League council.
